The exhibition Settled/Unsettled was conceived 4 years ago in conversation with fellow artists equally as passionate about social justice and the plight of refugees.

We are enormously grateful to Manly Art Gallery and Museum and in particular curator Katherine Roberts in helping make our vision come to life.

The exhibition received beautiful feedback, large attendance numbers, interest from media (radio and SBS Language) and high-profile attendance at opening and public programming events. It has drawn in a truly diverse audience from the migrant and refugee communities and other segments of the population.

We would love to bring the key works and the concept of this exhibition to a wider audience around Australia and are hoping that your gallery would be interested in including this exhibition in your upcoming schedule.

The way it has been curated previously has been hugely successful by combining established Australian artists with local refugee artists. This concept could easily be replicated by working with local refugee advocates/community organisations and giving local refugee artists access to participate in this exhibition. Hence the travelling core exhibition would include Mehwish Iqbal, Angus McDonald, Penny Byrne and Kathrin Longhurst. The exhibition can be scaled up or down depending on your space availability and requirements. This can be achieved by choosing to display a larger or smaller number of the refugee women's portraits or include a larger or smaller number of local refugee artists.

There are many opportunities to create a public program series that could include artist talks and music performances by refugee artists, settlement stories by local refugees, artist and sitter talks and kid's art workshops with local refugee artist for example.

We look forward to starting a dialogue with your gallery and hope to hear from you soon.
